

Mary and Joseph did.


Mary said she would do whatever the Lord wanted of her, even if it meant a really awkward conversation with her fiancé and the threat of being shunned in disgrace.

When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple to do what the Law of Moses says should be done for a new baby, the Spirit told Simeon to go into the temple. Simeon took the baby Jesus in his arms and praised God.

Luke 2: 27-28 CEV

In the days when Jesus was born, every new baby was brought to the temple to be dedicated to God by the priests in a special ceremony started by Moses. But the priests had stopped listening to God in their hearts, and they couldn't see how special Jesus was—His family was poor, and He looked like every other baby.

Mary and Joseph did the right thing by bringing Jesus to the temple, but God had plans to dedicate his Son in a special way.

Simeon was an old man who loved God and always listened to Him in his heart. God told him to go into the temple that very same day. When He obeyed, he saw Jesus and knew in his heart that he was looking at the Son of God.

DAY EIGHTEEN The Wise Men See a Star

Now after Jesus was born in Judea in the days of Herod the king, wise men came from the east to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is He who was born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the east and have come to worship Him."

Matthew 2:1-2 MEV

Have you ever gazed into the night sky and seen the blackest of nights with the brightest of stars? These great balls of fire look like twinkling gems because they are on fire—like sparkling clusters in the heavens.

Well, at about the time of Jesus's birth, wise men who lived far away saw an extraordinarily bright Star in the eastern sky that proclaimed Jesus's birth. They knew from their scientific studies that this Star was special: It pointed to Jesus.

But even though these wise men were fascinated by this Star, their real desire was for Jesus. They knew He was born to be King —and they wanted to worship Him.

That Star—and, really, every star—points us to Jesus the King, born a tiny baby at Christmas time, who we should worship.

King Jesus, help me worship You just like the wise men! Amen.



DAY NINETEEN Herod, a Not-So-Nice King

When Herod the king heard these things, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

Matthew 2:3 MEV

Did you ever see a bully? Someone who made someone do something for him—even though it was bad? Did you ever see someone lie to get what he wanted?

Usually that person who lies or uses other people is afraid—afraid of someone being greater than himself. And that is what Herod was like: fearful, jealous, and dishonest. He told the wise men that he wanted to worship Jesus, but he really wanted to kill Jesus.



You see, Herod knew Jesus was the real King. And he was afraid Jesus would take all his power away. Herod was a bad king.

But the Good News is that Jesus is the King! And He is a good King! He loves. He gives. He takes away fear. He sacrificed Himself. Even as a baby, Jesus was perfect and blameless.

Herod got it wrong because he was afraid of Jesus.

But we can get it right by trusting Jesus to love us, care for us, delight in us, and protect us.

Lord Jesus, help me to love You the way You love me. Amen.

And there it was—the star they had seen in the east! It led them until it came and stopped above the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed beyond measure.

Matthew 2:9-10 HCSB

Sometimes it's really hard to know the right thing to do. We want to choose good, but our fears can get in the way.

Often, we don't know which path to take—or whose advice to follow! If we don't follow the right path, we can get lost on our way.

The wise men also wanted to take the right path. They wanted to find Jesus so they could worship Him. But they needed to know how to get there so they would not get lost.

DAY TWENTY-TWO The Wise Men Take a Different Road


But being warned in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they returned to their own country by another route.
